



## Part-Time Visual Art Instructor

### Position:

The BW Community Arts School seeks a part-time visual art instructor. Ideal candidates will have experience in a classroom setting in a variety of visual art mediums. CAS Visual Art Instructors are energetic, engaging, and foster strong relationships with CAS students. CAS visual art classes generally occur during weeknight (evening) and weekend timeslots. This position primarily focuses on instructing students ages 6-18.

Visual art instructors are responsible for providing developmentally appropriate instruction on art techniques, preparing weekly lesson plans, and ensuring a supportive and positive learning environment for all students. Visual art instructors also work collaboratively with CAS staff to identify and source course materials in a timely fashion.
