



Part-Time Private Lesson Instructor – Violin (Suzuki) Baldwin Wallace University, Community Arts School

Position:

The BW Community Arts School seeks a qualified, experienced part-time Suzuki violin instructor to teach students of varied ages and abilities. Suzuki violin instructors have the ability to establish their own studio enrollment and teaching hours in coordination with and support from the Community Arts School. Additionally, Suzuki violin instructors are expected to participate in Suzuki Center group events (play-ins, recitals, etc.) and faculty planning meetings. CAS instructors are engaging, caring and foster strong relationships with CAS students. Generally, private lessons occur during weekday afternoons and evenings, and weekend timeslots. The instructor may also be involved in teaching Suzuki group classes as needed.

- Completed coursework and/or professional development in Suzuki training required.
